

Attention TEAMS participating in the 2022 SKUSA Supernationals!

As some of you already know, last year SKUSA was informed of new regulations that pertain to some of our larger **SELF-OWNED team tents** defined *Per Clark County Department of Building and Fire Prevention* as:

“Any membrane, tent, or FTTT over 400 square feet and any canopies over 700 square feet. Tents and canopies that are together or are separated by less than 10 feet are considered same.” Additionally, any canopy with a single wall attached becomes a tent.

The above mentioned shall require a permit issued by the **Clark County Fire Prevention Bureau** to exist and inhabit during the event.

Requirements to obtain the permit are as follows:

1. Each structure must provide a letter of intent. This is a simple letter telling them your basic contact information and that you are participating in the SKUSA SuperNationals on the dates you will be there.
2. A One-Million-Dollar liability policy naming Las Vegas Convention Center, Clark County Fire Prevention and Superkarts! USA employees, agents and volunteers of, and of course, yourself.

A certificate of flame resistance that identifies the tent/canopy in use. (See example below) This document was provided to you at the time of purchase. If you need to get a new copy, the certification tag is attached to your tent and will provide the information as to who you need to contact to obtain the document. **NOTE: The tag on the tent cannot be used as the document to submit your permit.**

3. Total compliance of the Clark County Fire Department RULES regarding Fire Safety:

Every entrant's pit area shall have a minimum of one 5-lb type ABC rated fire extinguisher (Type 2A 10BC) with current inspection for every 400 square feet of pit area. Fire extinguishers must always be visible and accessible. Competitors with trailers over 20-ft long shall have a minimum of one 20-lb type ABC fire extinguisher with current inspection for the trailer in addition to one 5-lb unit for each 400 square feet and "No Smoking" signs displayed every 100 square feet of pit area.

4. A copy of the map of your pit space (the same one you provide SKUSA with) defining the exits of the structure.

In the interest of assuring 100% compliance, SKUSA has secured Source One Events as a representing agent to fulfill these requirements for all of us. Source One will require the above mentioned documentation in order for them to represent you. SKUSA will require a certificate of compliance from Source One prior to you taking occupancy of your pit space.

The fees for this permit are as follows:

- **\$175** if you supply all of the above mentioned documents on or before 10/27/2022
- **\$350** if you supply the letter of intent and flame resistance certificate but wish Source One to add you to their event policy as additional insured. Again **MUST** be submitted and received by 10/27/2022
- **\$450** if any of the above documents are received after 10/27/22 regardless if you have insurance or not.

Absolute Deadline for all documents to be received by Source One is 10/27/22, as tents will begin going up shortly thereafter. Documents and payment by check should be sent all at once in one envelope to:
