

WELCOME: The staff and sponsors of SuperKarts! USA extend our welcome and thanks for your participation. As always, feel free to stop by the SKUSA Registration desk for answers to your questions or clarification of any procedure. Following are a few tips that will help you navigate the event and answer some of the most common questions.

IMPORTANT UPDATE for PENALTY NOTIFICATION: With the recent loss of the RaceHero/SKUSA Apps, you can view Live Timing and Results using the **Speedhive App** on your mobile device. Unfortunately, Speedhive doesn't currently show penalties at the bottom of results. We will be using our new WhatsApp Channel to post Penalties and all event related updates. Go to <u>http://skusa.link/whatsapp</u> or scan the QR code to the right. If you need help setting it up, please come to Registration.



ORLANDO KART CENTER PADDOCK & PIT SPOT RULES: Please join your fellow competitors and SKUSA in assuring we leave the track and premises in the same condition it was given to us by policing your pit area upon completion of each day's event. Pit areas will be inspected at the conclusion of the event. Oil/fuel spills, used tires or empty fuel cans left in unauthorized locations, and/or damage to asphalt of any kind <u>could result in an additional charge to the pit space renter – or a 1-race suspension to the violator</u>. These OKC pit rules will be enforced:

- No overnight camping is allowed inside the facility/paddock. The RV Camping Lot will be across the street from the facility.
- Trash should be deposited in the receptacles provided. PLEASE DO NOT pile loose trash around a trash can. If the trash bag is full, please remove it, seal it, and place it next to the can for collection and bag replacement.
- Please break down boxes. DO NOT put used tires or empty fuel cans IN the trash receptacles please pile them neatly alongside for disposal.
- Place a tarp on asphalt before working on karts. No staking of tents into the asphalt, and no fuel spills on the asphalt. No refueling under tents/canopies or in trailers, and no driving of karts in the parking areas.
- Alcohol is strictly prohibited during event hours.
- NO SMOKING in tents, trailers, on grid or in the Tech area and please pick up your butts.
- All pits must have a fire extinguisher one for every 400 SF of pit area (min 5 lbs, type ABC) that is visible and accessible at all times. SKUSA also requires a 20-lb fire extinguisher for each trailer over 20-ft in length.
- Keep all aisles and fire lanes <u>clear</u> at all times.
- Passenger and tow vehicles are NOT allowed in & out of the pit area during this event after pit parking is complete until
 move-out on Sunday (and at the discretion of the Operations Director). SKUSA staff will be available to assist attendees with
 bringing in supplies each morning. The only vehicles that will be allowed to move/park inside the pits are handicapped
 vehicles (with a current/official handicapped placard), emergency vehicles, SKUSA staff vehicles, and those with an eventspecific pass.
- NO motorized or non-motorized vehicles are allowed in the parking areas or to be moving thru the pits while karts are hot on track (other than SKUSA staff & emergency vehicles). Handicapped guests are excluded from this rule, but will be required to show proper ID and an official placard to receive a pass from the SKUSA Registration desk or parking staff for their handicapped vehicle. No scooters are allowed at all on the premises for anyone under 21 years of age.
- Move-out on Sunday night may begin AFTER the FINAL checkered flag (but preferably upon completion of the podium ceremonies). Earlier move-outs must be pre-approved by the Operations Director.
- Check the **latest** Event Schedule for gate hours and when the various track areas and departments open/close available onsite at Registration, and on the SKUSA website.
- Pets are allowed on the event premises, but must be on a leash or inside a vehicle or trailer at all times. Please pick up after your pet. Neither SKUSA nor track management are responsible for pet behavior. Pets must stay out of the grid, tech and scale areas and away from the track at all times.

TRANSPONDERS: Beginning with the **3rd practice on Friday**, drivers will not be allowed on the track without the assigned transponder being properly mounted on the kart – and will be black flagged if the kart is not being recognized by the Timing & Scoring system.

It is the driver's responsibility to ensure that the transponder is sufficiently charged; checking the unit frequently for a minimum of two green blinks is the best way to do that. If a transponder is not working properly, it will need to be replaced – either by a personal unit or a rented one from SKUSA.

A rental transponder can be acquired at the SKUSA Registration Desk according to the Event Schedule. If you change or replace your transponder with one that is different from your original registration, both Scoring & Registration personnel must document the new code.

QUIET RULE TO BE ENFORCED AT THIS EVENT: The only place that an engine may be started/running (besides on the track) is in the immediate area outside of the competitor's pit spot/tent and/or at the direction of the chief grid steward (1-2 minutes prior to on-track segment). Do not push a running kart to the grid. Penalties will apply for violations.

GRID RULE 2: A <u>maximum</u> of two mechanics per current-session entry are allowed in the pre-grid, and must be wearing visible mechanic credentials or an event-specific wristband.

GRID RULE 3: Other than on the track, the only places where a kart can be moving under its own power are (a) in the pre-grid area, (b) in grid out onto the track, and (c) in the exit lane leading to the scales. Karts must be pushed from pit to the pre-grid and from scales to the pit.

GRID RULE 4: There will be NO HOT PIT allowed at this event (which means there will be no pulling off track to make adjustments and then pulling back onto the track during the same session).

PENALTIES: Shall be assessed per SKUSA Rulebook. The NEW WhatsApp Channel <u>http://skusa.link/whatsapp</u> is the official resource for notification of any penalties and/or revisions due to protests. In the event of a protest that causes a penalty to be adjusted or reversed, this will also take place only in the NEW Channel. Make sure to check the NEW Channel regularly for any changes or adjustments that may affect your next on track session. A Penalty Steward will be available to clarify or discuss any on-track penalties that are unclear, as well as for filing a **PROTEST** (see SKUSA Rules section 109).

REGISTRATION MATERIALS/RACING FORMS: The following items will be supplied at the SKUSA REGISTRATION DESK:

- **Two (2) Pre-Tech Certification Sheet(s):** (ONE FOR <u>EACH</u> RACE DAY). Fill it out COMPLETELY and sign. Bring the form TO THE GRID for your <u>first competition session EACH RACE DAY</u> (i.e., Qualifying), where race personnel will collect it. You will not be allowed on the track for qualifying without a <u>completed</u> pre-tech sheet. Pre-event kart safety compliance is every competitor's responsibility. The Pre-Tech sheet will serve as a general guideline to items that must be in compliance prior to competition. Karts and driver's safety equipment will be randomly spot checked throughout the event to assure compliance. Violations observed prior to entering any segment of competition will require immediate repair. Violations observed after any segment may result in one or more of the following: fines, loss of track time, starting position penalties, and finishing position penalties.
- Driver Profle: Used for race announcing and live streaming. Please fill out and return it to the REGISTRATION desk prior to Qualifying.
- **Proper Event Wristbands:** *Drivers* One band is included with the race entry for the event weekend; *Attendees* All others must acquire the correct wristband and/or annual credential and wear it throughout the event.
- **Transponder Rentals:** If you have rented a transponder from SKUSA, your name will be on the list in Registration, and it will be available for pickup <u>and mandatory use</u> according to the Event Schedule. **Never bolt a transponder directly onto your seat!** If the transponder is damaged by a bolt, you will be financially responsible for any repairs and possible replacement. If you need a transponder mount, they can be purchased at the Registration desk for \$6.00. If a rented transponder is lost or damaged, you are responsible for the replacement cost (min \$450). Rented transponders will be collected at the scales after the main event <u>on Sunday</u>. See Event Schedule. *Should you DNF or DNS prior to the last session of the event, be sure to return your rented transponder to REGISTRATION prior to leaving the premises.*
- New Mandatory Event Sticker Diagram and Policy (Revised 1/1/25): Indicates where event and sponsor stickers are to be placed on your kart. This is a tech item, and failure to comply <u>will</u> result in forfeiture of purses and/or prizes won.
- Printed Event Schedule, Tire Pick Up Schedule, Required Kart Stickers, and Track Map.

THE TIRE DESK will distribute practice, race and/or rain tires purchased from SKUSA, as well as the required ENGINE SEALS, CHASSIS SEALS, and PIPE SEALS. ****Make sure to pick up your RACE tires during your designated Class time. Please refer to the Tire Pick Up Schedule AND Event Schedule to make sure you are ready to go!

NOTE: SKUSA reserves the right to revise event parameters without prior notice. Furthermore, the Race Director reserves the right to modify the event format, its length, or any particular segment thereof, in the interest of safety or operational considerations. Additionally, the Race Director reserves the right to issue a green, white or checkered flag, which will declare and record a conclusion of that particular segment, regardless of length or time.
